#### Our Work Around the World


ActionAid works for <u>systems change</u> to achieve rights, redistribute wealth, and build resilience in four areas - economic justice and public services, climate justice, women's rights and feminist alternatives, and humanitarian response. Read "An Invitation to Partner with ActionAid". Our interconnected approach to systems-change work is summarized below:

- Our economic justice work focuses on research, mobilization, and advocacy for fundamental changes to the international financial architecture which perpetuates a colonial, extractive economic model. One that limits public investment in gender-responsive public services thus exacerbating inequalities.
- Our climate justice work focuses on research, mobilization, and campaigning for a shift in private and public financing from climate crisis-inducing investments to community-led projects for a just energy transition and natural farming practices (agroecology).
- Our women's rights and feminist alternatives work focuses on strengthening women's leadership, advancing decent work for women, and combating 'modern' day slavery.
- Our humanitarian work is guided by a feminist humanitarian signature that prioritizes women and youth leadership, shifting power to frontline communities, building resilience and sustainability, and accountability to affected communities.
